


NSW Reaching New Safety Records!

Moranbah North Secondary Support and 605 Development

Geotechnical experts at Moranbah North developed a support plan with an extensive safety factor. The first pass on the new faceline was to be supported with lots of 10m mega bolts.

In 8 days, over 1400 x 10m mega bolts were installed and grouted with 2 x multi bolters, 2 x QDS bolters and a continuous miner. All of these were installed without incident and 3-4 days earlier than originally planned. The labour intensive work completed by the Secondary Support and Development crews is highly commendable.

Special mention also goes to The Commander and Chief, Tony Zahra. Tony gave up his weekend to ensure all planning and sequencing was followed and executed without incident. Congratulations to all employees involved.

A BBQ was hosted to thank all involved in this huge success & to go through some safety stats and training in preparation for the upcoming busy Longwall move period.
